2010 Study Abroad Program
Payment and Refund Schedule**

Fees to be paid to the Bursar's Office

Tuition and fees should be paid directly to the UGA Bursar's Office after course registration according to regular UGA payment schedule. Payment instructions will be given when you register in OASIS.

- Tuition: \$1026 for 6 credit hours (NOTE: You must register for 6 credit hours). **(Fee subject to change).**
- Technology Fee: \$21 **(Fee subject to change).**
- For non-University System of Georgia, out-of-state residents: \$250 out-of-state fee. **(Fee subject to change).**

Fees to be paid to the Program

- Program Fees: \$5000

Make checks payable to: UGA, Maymester in Tanzania

- Application and \$500 non-refundable application fee due by: December 16, 2009.
- First installment of \$1500 due by: February 16.
- Second installment of \$1500 due by March 16.
- Third and final installment of \$1500 due by April 6.
- Kilimanjaro Climbers only, installment of \$1300 due by: March 2.

Deferred payment of program fees:

You must provide African Studies Institute with a copy of the award letter for any loans, grants, scholarships that you will use to cover any portion of the program fee in order to defer this payment until funds are received. This must be done prior to the deadline stated for payments. You will be required to pay any portion of the program fee not covered by financial aid at the stated deadlines. You may not defer payment of application fee!

Refund Schedule

- If the program is full at the time a student applies, or the student is not accepted into the program, the \$500 application fee will be refunded.
- If a student withdraws from program on or before April 13, 2010 then student will receive a refund of all fees minus \$500 application fee and all fees already paid by program on behalf of student.
- If a student withdraws from program after April 13, 2010 no refund will be made to student of any fees paid.

Program Cancellation

- If the program is cancelled due to insufficient student enrollment, then a full refund of monies paid will be given to each student.
- If the program is cancelled due to an act of war or terrorism, a State Department warning or other circumstances that make the program location unsafe, all monies not already spent on behalf of the student will be refunded to each student.

Requests for Refunds

- All requests for refunds must be made **in writing** to the program director, and received in the African Studies Institute office (321 Holmes/Hunter Academic Bldg, UGA, Athens, GA 30602) by deadlines noted above.
