The development of the Southeast peanut representative farms has been one of the most significant activities for the National Center for Peanut Competitiveness. The results derived from these farms had a major impact on the development of the 2002 Farm Bill as it relates to the new peanut program. The second area is the development and execution with Georgia NASS in developing a peanut cost of production survey for the Southeast region and collecting the data. Information from this survey will aid the research on the various production economic issues as they relate to peanuts given the new peanut program that is being implemented.

The continual development of the National Center for Peanut Competitiveness such as the joint projects with Auburn University and the University of Florida. One of the projects is call FARM, which stands for Field Adaptive Research Modeling. This is a different approach to examining competitiveness issues. Another area for the Center was the ability to leverage funding in order to ensure that every Georgia County Agent with peanuts in their county had access to HERB along with the appropriate software. Also, the formulation of the Peanut Product Research and Development Laboratory as an arm under the Peanut Center umbrella was significant. The development of the software program entitled FARMCATS – Field and Resource Management Cost Accounting Tracking System was another major achievement. This software was developed through a joint effort of extension personnel with the University of Florida and researchers from Auburn University and University of Georgia.
