ATHENS, GA – The University Union Student Programming Board at the University of Georgia will present the next Dawgs After Dark program, “Cities Across America,” on Friday, October 13, 2006. The event is scheduled from 10:00 p.m. until 2:00 a.m. at the Tate Student Center and is one of numerous Homecoming Week events sponsored by the Department of Campus Life.
