IMMIGRATION PANEL: The Hispanic Concerns Committee of Athens and the UGA Just Faith group will host a panel on immigration Monday, November 7th at 7:00 pm at the Catholic Center. Speakers include: Sr. Joyce Ann Hertzog, o.p. Archdiocesan Parish Social Ministry Coordinator; Sr. Margarita Martin, acj, Oasis Católico Santa Rafaela; Tisha R. Tallman, Regional Counsel, Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund; Ray MacNair, Moderator, Economic Justice Coalition. Immigration Reform legislation will soon be introduced

into the U.S. Congress and the Georgia Legislature. "The U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, with 37 other national religious organizations has called for a comprehensive system of immigration reform 'that establishes a safe and humane immigration system' consistent with their faith traditions of welcoming immigrants."
