

Look for the BEST possible answer.

Follow the directions carefully.

Skip difficult questions
and return to them later.

ALL parts of the answer
must be correct.

The answer must make grammatical sense with the question.

Answers with extreme qualifiers such as all, never, only, completely, and always, are usually **INCORRECT**.

If you don't know, GUESS if there is no penalty for incorrect answers.

Change answers if you can justify that you have made a mistake.

Try to answer the question before looking at the possible choices.

Read ALL the choices before selecting one (the BEST answer may come later!)

If two choices are very much alike, one is probably the correct answer.

If two choices are direct opposites, one is probably the correct answer.

The first choice is least likely to be the correct answer (especially if "all OR none of the above" are choices).
