



Breeze Ways

During a recent inspection from our campus Office of Environmental Safety, it was pointed out that we need to keep our breeze ways and stairwells cleared of all items. The breeze ways and stairwells are considered a "means of egress" and anything left in those areas are a potential trip hazards. Therefore, in accordance with your Housing Agreement policies, **ALL PERSONAL ITEMS MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE BREEZE WAYS AND STAIRWELL AT ALL TIMES WHEN THE ITEMS ARE NOT IN USE.** This means that all personal items must be kept in your apartment when you are not using them. For example, you may bring a chair onto the breeze way to sit in, but you must return it into your apartment when you are not sitting in the chair. From this time on, **ANY ITEMS FOUND IN THE**

BREEZE WAYS OR STAIRWELLS ARE SUBJECT TO REMOVAL BY FGH STAFF WITHOUT PRIOR NOTICE.



Insurance

Every year a few residents experience events in their apartments that result in damages to personal items. The Housing Agreement that you signed specifically limits the University's responsibility for such damages (see the section on Liability in your Housing Agreement). The agreement strongly encourages you to purchase renter's insur-

ance to cover such losses. Many residents are not well informed about renter's insurance or how to purchase it. This link <http://nssinc.com/> will take you to a web site of one company that offers renters insurance. The site illustrates the kinds of coverage and premiums required for such insurance. Family and Graduate Housing does not endorse this or any particular company. We offer it only for illustrative purposes. There are many insurance companies who offer such policies. We would encourage you to shop around and find the policy that best fits the coverage and cost that you believe you need. We would encourage you to review the web site to see what is covered and consider how many of the items listed you possess. How would you replace those items if something out of your control damaged or destroyed them? Consider the information and then take the steps that you believe are necessary to protect your personal property.

Something for the Tailgate...

Crispy Chicken Fingers

Ingredients:

1 1/4 pound boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cut across into 1/2-inch pieces

1/2 cup low fat buttermilk

Cooking spray

4 cups whole-grain corn cereal (recommended: Corn Chex or cornflakes)

1/4 teaspoon salt

Freshly ground pepper

Honey-Mustard Sauce (recipe follows)

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Combine the chicken and buttermilk in a shallow dish. Cover and chill for 15 minutes.

Spray a baking sheet with cooking spray.

Put the cereal in a sealed plastic bag and crush with a rolling pin. Transfer the crumbs to a shallow dish. Season the chicken with the salt and a few grinds of pepper. Dip each piece of chicken in the cereal to fully coat and arrange on the baking sheet. Bake until cooked through, about 8 minutes. Leave the chicken on the baking sheet to cool slightly. It will become crispier.

Honey-Mustard Sauce:

1/2 cup Dijon mustard

1 tablespoon mayonnaise

3 tablespoons honey

In a small bowl, stir together the mustard and mayonnaise until smooth. Stir in the honey.

Yield: 1 1/4 cups



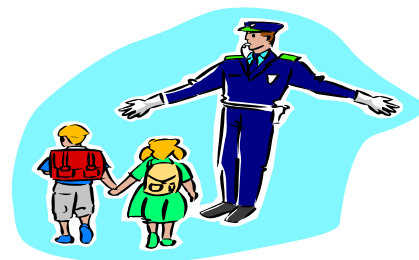

The Maintenance Corner

The maintenance crew worked on, or is currently working on 452 work orders between the dates 7/24/06 and 8/24/06.

We will have all of the black iron rails and stair cases in Brandon Oaks painted over the next few weeks.

We will receive the HV/AC units for R building on 8/28/06 and we will start installing them as soon as possible.

We have had another busy summer. We had over 200 apartments to turn over for the Fall semester.

The renovation of J building is complete and all apartments are occupied now.

The Physical Plant has started the renovations in K building and we hope to have it complete by December 15th. We will decommission L building the first week of January 07 and pre-

pare it for renovation.

The gutter guards have been installed on all buildings except E and F. We will have them installed when they are renovated.

We are replacing old worn out counter tops sinks and faucets in the Rogers Road area.

We have completed pressure washing M and N buildings and we are starting on P-building of Rogers Road. It takes about a week and a half to wash a building this large. We will start on Q-building next.

Please do not set hot items on your counter tops without a hot plate under it, this will damage the top. Tops for Rogers Road cost \$587.00 each, and this does not include the installation. If you damage these tops you will be charged for the repair.

*** Please report any pest control problems before each Friday. Lavender Pest Control comes out every Friday to treat apartments

for pest. Do not leave food out or trash in your apartment. Wipe down your counter tops and stoves to remove grease and oil. The pest will not eat the bait in your apartment if they have good old home cooking to eat!
