The Clinical Psychology Program in the Department of Psychology in the Franklin College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Georgia, Athens, GA is conducting this search to strengthen its position as one of the leading Clinical Psychology programs in the United States. Current areas of research expertise in the clinical program include anxiety; alcohol/substance use; depression; marriage, parenting, child and family; personality; prevention; aggression and victimization; dementia, and pediatrics. We invite applicants who would complement any of these areas as well as any who would contribute to emerging foci in the department on clinical neuroimaging and genetic/epigenetic processes. Applicants must be eligible for appointment at the rank of Professor of Psychology.

Successful candidates will have a well-established, highly visible research program and will be expected to contribute to our strong graduate and undergraduate training mission as well as continue their externally funded research program. Successful applicants will join a nationally prominent and productive clinical research faculty. Collaboration with other faculty both within the department and across departments will be supported and encouraged. Established associations with the Institute for Behavioral Research, the Institute of Gerontology, the Bioimaging Research Center, and the Biomedical and Health Sciences Institute offer excellent additional research support as well as venues for collaborative research opportunities. Faculty members are expected to support the college's goals of creating and sustaining a diverse and inclusive learning environment.
