Conservation and Reinvestment Act

The conservation and Reinvestment Act of 1999 (CARA) was not passed in the 106th congress despite unprecedented support in the U. S. House and Senate. Two other bills, the Commerce, Justice, and State Appropriations (CJS) bill and the Interior Appropriations bill were passed as CARA alternatives. Unfortunately these bills provide far less money for wildlife conservation. The original CARA bill provided \$350 million to the states for wildlife conservation and secured these funds for 15 years. The CJS bill and the Interior Appropriation bill combined provide \$100 million and these funds are allocated for only one year. Half of these funds must be applied for under a competitive grant process and will not allow states to plan long term conservation efforts. Supporter of CARA are looking forward to the next legislative session and more success concerning funding for state wildlife conservation.
